


Dot Mandala Necklace Class

March 21, 2026 2-4 pm

\$25/student or \$40/two students



Intermediate art class open to 16 students ages 10-100. Please use cash or check. Students will learn beginning circular dot painting techniques. Practice begins on paper then students will advance to creating a 1-3 inch pendant on a smooth Alaska beach rock. Necklaces will have finials and a silk 18 inch cord.

Teacher:

Rachel Grossl, I am a KAC board member and art enthusiast. My life is full of various art mediums and I fully believe that creativity is an untapped resource for everyone. I have taught both in the public and private schools and multiple art classes with the Kenai Art Center and the Kenai Peninsula Quilt Guild.

Skills:

A willingness to try dot techniques, no advanced painting skills required
The ability to work fine detail

Techniques:

Very basic color theory to help choose color pallets
Dot tool use/paint application for repeatable results
How to paint mandalas
Without applied grids or guides
NSEW method
Cascade dotting
Swooshes - (difficult to master)

Class:

2 hour class with all supplies provided. Direct instruction initially then the majority of the time will be individual work.

Supplies Provided:

Set of 5 double sided dotting tools .5-2 mm in diameter
Acrylic paints - basic color scheme - students are welcome to bring paints from home
Pallet to mix colors (paper plate)
Practice paper
Choice of 2 rocks for pendants
One necklace finial (silver, gold, bronze, black color)
18" black silk cord necklace
Glue to attach finial to pendant

Suggestions:

I suggest that students leave their necklaces to allow the jewelry glue (E6000) to set and pick them up during gallery hours next week.

Purchases: Students interested in continuing their painting can purchase their tool set for \$7 and extra necklace finial/cord for \$3.
